"Jacob's Scrap" (Genesis 32:22-32) The Book of Genesis, part 35 Sunday, April 14th, 2024

Sermon Summary

- After sending his servants, livestock, and family ahead of him, Jacob became confronted by an unnamed man, who during the night, engaged him in physical combat (Gen. 32:22-24).
- With daybreak approaching, and Jacob prevailing in the fight, the man touched Jacob's hip, causing him to become hobbled; asking Jacob to release him. But Jacob refused to let go, unless the man would offer onto him a blessing (v. 25-26).
- Prior to blessing Jacob, the man insisted that Jacob's name become changed to 'Israel,' which loosely means, 'he struggles with God' (v. 27-28).
- While the man refused to identify Himself to Jacob, Jacob resolved that he had been wrestling with God Himself leading Jacob to name the area Peniel/Penuel "the face of God", for here he had met with God, and been delivered (v. 30).
- Some might suggest that Jacob only wrestled with an angel, yet none but God holds the power and authority to directly offer a blessing upon a person.
- We shouldn't think that Jacob was physically able to fight God to a veritable standstill; but rather, God had acted mercifully.
- A theophany involves a physical manifestation of God within history that causes Him to become more accessible to the human senses; either in human form, or something else.
- When confronted, Jacob wasn't seeking physical dominance; but rather, he ultimately sought his opponent's blessing.
- While Jacob wrestled with God, he was perhaps embroiled in an even greater conflict with his demanding self-interest.
- To overcome our sin, we must first submit to the Lord.

Jacob didn't defeat God in a physical battle on this evening; but rather, he lay to waste his own sense of independence, as he finally himself relented to his insurmountable need for God and His mercy.
